

Beginner Crochet Class Scarf Sampler Pattern

Rows	Instructions	Notes
Foundation Row	Chain an odd number (sample scarf used 23 chains)	All stitch counts will be based on the green sample scarf shown in the photos.
Row 1	Sc into the third stitch from the hook and in each chain across, ch1, turn work. (21 scs)	
Row 2	Hdc across, ch1, turn work. (21 hdc)	Work your first hdc (half double crochet) into the first available stitch.
Row 3	Repeat Row 2 (21 hdc)	
Row 4	Repeat Row 2 (21 hdc)	
Row 5	Sc across, ch1, turn work. (21 scs)	Work your first sc (single crochet) into the first available stitch.
Row 6	Sc in first stitch, [ch2, skip one stitch, sc in nxt stitch] 10x, chain 1, turn work. (10 loops created)	<h2>Tips for Beginners!</h2> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Don't forget to crochet into that last stitch of each Row. It's easy to miss since it does not lay perfectly flat like the other stitches. Look for it, and to be sure, count your stitches after completing each Row to check. There are counts provided at the end of each Row's instructions for you. Once you gain confidence, you will not need to count. • Mind your tension! It is vital that you maintain even tension throughout your work so that it will not warp. • Don't be afraid to frog (rip out stitches) and start over. It's part of the learning process. • Use YouTube to learn how to do the basic stitches. There are ample videos to get you started.
Row 7	Skip first stitch, [2sc in chain space] 10x, sc in last stitch of row, chain 1, turn work. (21 scs)	
Row 8	Repeat Row 6 (10 loops created)	
Row 9	Repeat Row 7 (21 scs)	
Row 10	Repeat Row 6 (10 loops created)	
Row 11	Repeat Row 7 (21 scs)	
Row 12	Repeat Rows 2-11 until your scarf is your desired length.	
Next Row	Sc across, ch1, turn work. (21 scs)	
Last Row	Sc across, finish off, weave in end. (21 scs)	

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
